**Series History**  
This is the third meeting between the Falcons and the Red Flash, with BGSU leading the series 2-0. The Falcons won in overtime by a score of 80-74 in the inaugural meeting in 2004-05. They also defeated the Red Flash 77-55 in 2005-06.

**Home for the Holidays**  
The Red Flash have two players from Maryland on their roster. Junior guard Shawna Scott is from Baltimore, and freshman Brittany Lilley hails from Severna Park.

**The Falcons**  
Bowling Green has won the MAC Regular Season Championship in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008, and advanced to the second round of the WNIT tournament last season before falling to Michigan State 74-66. They were picked to win both the East Division and the MAC Tournament this season. Sophomore Lauren Prochaska was named to the All-MAC Preseason team. Prochaska was the MAC Freshman-of-the-Year in 2007-08 and averaged 14.8 points per game, collecting a total 502 points for the Falcons.

**Preseason Poll**  
The Red Flash were picked to finish 8th in the Northeast Conference in a poll released by the NEC on Thursday. Robert Morris, who received a total of 4 first-place votes was chosen to win the conference this season. The poll is voted on by the head coaches.

**Red Flash Quick Facts**  
Shawna Scott tied her career for steals against Lehigh with 4 ... Britney Hodges earned her 150th career assists on Saturday and now has 153 total... Freshman Sarah Thorn scored her first career points on a three-pointer on Saturday vs. Lehigh... Janie Killian led the team in both points (13) and rebounds (8).

**New Faces**  
Susan Robinson Fruchtl returns for her second season at the helm of the Red Flash and will have a few new faces on her staff and on her bench. Assistant coach Joe Haigh comes to Loretto from Virginia Commonwealth where he was the Director of Basketball Operations. Haigh works with post players, as well as organizes SFU basketball camps, video coordination and scheduling. Tiffani Selhorst spent the last 2 seasons at Ohio University, where she was a graduate assistant to current Boston College coach Sylvia Crawley. Selhorst will be in charge of academic support, team travel and strength & conditioning among other duties. Crystal Horton was an assistant coach at Central Michigan University during the 2006-07. After taking last season off to get married and have her son, Horton will handle scouting, recruiting and guard development.

### The Schedule

The Red Flash will face Boston College for the first time ever in the season opener on Nov. 14 in Chestnut Hill, Mass. They will then travel to Virginia to play at Longwood before returning to Loretto. Lehigh University will be the team's first home game on Nov. 22. Boston and Lehigh are two of nine non-conference opponents the Red Flash will play this year.

The toughest stretch of the schedule comes immediately following Christmas, when the Red Flash travel to three states (Ohio, Virginia and Connecticut) in less than two weeks before returning home to host Central Connecticut in a 4 PM match up at DeGol.

### SFU-SFC Matchup to be Televised

The Red Flash's game at St. Francis College on January 24 at 2 PM will be broadcast on FSN-Pittsburgh. The men's team will also play St. Francis College in a televised game at 4 PM on that day.

### Milestones

- Shawna Scott needs 3 more three-pointers to have 50 in her career. She also needs 18 assists to have 300.
- Britney Hodges needs 1 more assists to have 150 in her career, and 11 free throws to put her at 50.
- Sam Leach got her 200th career point vs. Longwood, and now has 205. She also recored her 50th career assist.
- Whitney Robinson needs 20 more points to reach 500 in her career.

The team will play at DeGol only nine times this season, as opposed to the record-tying 14 home game schedule that was played last year. Bowling Green, Bucknell, and Lehigh are among the teams the Red Flash will play host to this year. The impressive schedule consists of teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Patriot League (3), the Mid-American Conference, the Big East, and the Atlantic 10.

NEC play begins on Dec. 6 when the Flash host St. Francis (NY) at DeGol and continues for most of the season. Only four of the remaining games at that point will be non-conference matches.

As always, the team's match-up with Duquesne on Dec. 18 in Pittsburgh will be one of the season's most anticipated. The Red Flash were able to outscore the Dukes in two overtimes last year, and hope to turn that victory into a winning streak this season. This will be the second time Robinson Fruchtl and fellow Penn State alum Suzie McConnell-Serio will meet as head coaches.

# 2008-09 Season Outlook

Head Coach Susan Robinson Frucht's second season at the helm of the Red Flash team is expected to more closely resemble Flash teams of the past. After going 6-23 last year, SFU is aiming for a spot in the Northeast Conference Championships. With Emily Bollinger being last year's only departing senior, many of the faces will be familiar to the Red Flash faithful, and the talented newcomers will surely make their presence known. The schedule also holds some familiarity in matchups with in-state rival Duquesne, Longwood and Youngstown State. Some new additions, like Boston College and Cincinnati will provide for exciting challenges throughout the season.

## Point Guards

**Returners ::** Shawna Scott will return for her senior season as the team's leader in free throws, with an outstanding .828 percentage. She will be looking to make a significant impact in that area for her final season with the Flash. After finishing fourth in the NEC in assist to turnover ratio, she showed flashes of what we will be seeing this year.

**Newcomers ::** Sarah Thorn, who is expected to compete for playing time, led Pennsbury East in assists for three consecutive seasons, and will have a significant role in her first season with the team.

## Wings

**Returners ::** Red Flash standout Britney Hodges, who led the team in scoring last year with 445 points (15.3 ppg), will continue to be an offensive threat. Hodges' high scoring ways have the potential to make up for the absence of graduated senior Emily Bollinger. The team's leader in minutes is unlikely to see a decrease in playing time after playing 1,062 minutes last season. She will return as the team's leader in field goal attempts, with 240 more than second-place Shawna Scott. She should also receive consideration for NEC honors, after finishing eighth in the league in scoring and fourth in assists and free throw percentage last season.

Sophomore Samantha Leach is also expected to continue her development. Not even an injury could stop her from making an impact last season, scoring 25 three-pointers in 66 attempts. The Ohio native will look to move up the ranks after finishing fourth on the team in scoring last season with 180 points (7.8 ppg) in 23 games. Leach finished ninth in the conference in 3-pt field goal percentage during the 2007-08 season and has the potential to be among the NEC leaders this season.

Allison Daly looks to build on a solid freshman campaign in which she had 75 points and 68 rebounds. Her totals will no doubt in-

crease as her playing time goes up from the 15.2 minutes she was averaging last season. She can also be counted on as a 3-point threat, after finishing third on the team overall with 12 three-point shots made last season.

Freshmen Quinessa Johnson and Brittany Lilley will both be looking to contribute at the guard spot this season. Johnson played on consecutive championship teams at Lakota West High School in West Chester, Ohio, while Lilley averaged 14.5 points per game at Severna Park High School in Severna Park, Md.

## Posts

**Returners ::** Senior Whitney Robinson will be counted on to fill the shoes of Bollinger, who was lost to graduation. The West Virginia native is set to see an increase in playing time after starting seven of 28 games last season. Robinson finished last season with 221 points (7.9) and 156 rebounds in 723 minutes. Robinson has the ability to be one of the top rebounders in the NEC as she finished 14th in the conference in rebounds in 2007-08.

Taryn Adamski will return for her senior campaign much more adept at center with a full season of playing the position under her belt. The former power forward will be joined by true center Janie Killian, who will look to be a defensive powerhouse in her junior campaign. While Killian was sixth on the team in scoring last year, she was third in rebounds. At 6'4" she is without a doubt the team's best blocker. Her team-leading 21 blocked shots were good for ninth in the Northeast Conference. And with Bollinger gone, Killian takes over as the team leader in field goal percentage. Newcomer Kelsey Caruthers may prove valuable enough to allow Adamski to return to her true position at power forward.

**Newcomers ::** Freshman Najah Prescott played at Cardinal Dougherty in Philadelphia and is expected to compete for playing time at power forward. Kelsey Caruthers averaged 13.7 points and nine rebounds at Penn Manor, and totaled 874 points in her four-year career. They will both be looking to make a significant impact in their freshmen campaigns.

Joe Vesnesky will return to the airwaves for his 30th season with the Red Flash. Vesnesky will be joined by Bernie Jubeck for all home games and at select road games. # Head Coach Susan Robinson Fruchtl



**S U S A N ROBINSON FRUCHTL** WAS ANNOUNCED AS THE SIXTH WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACH IN PROGRAM HISTORY ON APRIL 25, 2007 AND

WILL LEAD THE RED FLASH INTO ITS FIFTH DECADE OF INTERCOLLEGIATE COMPETITION.

Robinson Fruchtl oversees an NCAA Division I program that has won nine Northeast Conference titles and made nine NCAA tournament appearances over the past thirteen seasons. The Red Flash women's basketball program marked its 40th year of competition during the 2007-08 season.

After guiding the team to a 6-23 season last year, Robinson Fruchtl is mixing new faces with old and taking the future in her own hands. Instead of simply remembering the championships of years past, the Red Flash team will look to be looking to add some of their own.

Prior to her arrival in Loretto, Robinson Fruchtl spent three consecutive seasons on Rene Portland's staff at Penn State Univer-

sity, and her eighth season overall with the Lady Lions. The 1992 Penn State graduate helped guide her alma mater to a composite 161-83 record (.660) including four 20-win seasons.

A former All-American and PSU's only recipient of the Wade Trophy, which is presented annually to the best women's college basketball player in NCAA Division I, Robinson Fruchtl rejoined the Penn State staff in May of 2004 after serving as an assistant from 1993 to 1998. During her time in Happy Valley she worked primarily with post players as well as assisting in recruiting. It was under her guidance that former Lady Lion Amanda Brown developed into a third-round selection in the 2007 WNBA draft by the Los Angeles Sparks.

After leaving the Lady Lions in 1998, Robinson Fruchtl enrolled at Slippery Rock University to pursue her Master's Degree in Secondary Guidance. During that time she served as a volunteer assistant from 1998-2000 for the North Allegheny girl's basketball team. Robinson Fruchtl also has a Master's in Higher Education, which she earned from PSU in 1998.

In June of 2000 she took over as the head girl's basketball coach at Beaver Area High School, where she also worked as one of the school's guidance counselors. She helped revive the basketball program, and led the Lady Cats to the PIAA Class AAA Playoffs

in each of her final two seasons.

Then known as Susan Robinson, she graduated from Penn State with a B.S. in exercise and sports science in 1992 and was married to Tony Fruchtl in 1997. Robinson Fruchtl is one of only two players in Lady Lion history to accumulate 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds and was the program's all-time leading scorer with 2,253 points until her record was broken in 2004.

In 1992, the same season she won the Wade Trophy, she was named a consensus All-American and earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American honors. As a rookie in 1989, she won Atlantic 10 Freshman-of-the-Year honors. Twice she was named to the All-Atlantic 10 Conference team, and in 1991, she was chosen as the conference Player of the Year. The Center Point, W.Va. native served as captain of the 1990-91 PSU squad that compiled a 29-2 record and a No. 1 National ranking in the final AP poll of the regular season.

In 1990 Robinson Fruchtl was a member of the Junior National Team, and also played for the U.S. Select team that toured Europe. Following her collegiate career she played professionally for one season in Japan.
