Rural Outreach Chemistry for Kids Code of Conduct

- Volunteers should arrive at the ROCK room (Science Center 219) or other designated place on time and ready to leave for the event. Be sure to note the departure time when you register for the event.
- 2. While attending the event, all volunteers must conduct themselves appropriately. This involves being courteous, treating all those at the event with respect and avoiding any disruptive behavior.
- 3. Volunteers must listen to the ROCK event leader. Volunteers are expected to assist at the event and be enthusiastic. Remember, science is fun!
- 4. Volunteers must report any student misbehavior or suspicious behavior to either the ROCK event leader or to the teacher in charge immediately.
- 5. Volunteers are representing themselves, the ROCK program, and Saint Francis University so it is expected you will serve as a positive role model.
- 6. If you do not follow the dress code, you will not be permitted to attend the event.

Dress Code:

- Pants must be worn. Jeans are allowed, but cannot have holes or tears. NO shorts or skirts.
- NO sandals or open toe shoes.
- SFU shirts or sweatshirts must be worn. If you do not have any SFU attire, then a
 plain red shirt must be worn.
- Shirts must be of appropriate length. No midriff should be showing while standing or while bending over.
- Long hair should be pulled back so that it does not interfere with participation in the event.
- Earring are permitted. However, no other piercings should be showing.
- Tattoos should be covered.
- All volunteers are expected to be clean and well-groomed.
- 7. ROCK equipment should be treated with respect. Any volunteer who purposely damages ROCK equipment or is caught stealing ROCK supplies will be punished accordingly.
