

This 28-day program is based at the University's site in Ambialet. You will explore the French countryside, local castles, incredible cathedrals, museums, restaurants and more. The excursions will take you to many awe-inspiring sites, including a five-day stay in Barcelona.

The price of the program is \$3,500 plus the cost of tuition (\$485 per credit). Students must take at least six credits to be eligible for financial aid. The program price includes airfare, airport transfers, international insurance coverage, excursions, on-site transportation, room accommodations and meals.

Program Curriculum:

The chemistry, criminal justice, and fermentation classes blend in with the European travel experience. Students will explore the legal system in France and Spain, study forensic science with hands-on learning while exploring the Tarn river and surrounding towns and villages, and explore the fermented foods in Europe with a visit to a cheese cave and taste testing wines from the region.

CHEM 108: Forensic Science (3 credits):

Learn forensic science and criminalistics in this chemistry course for all majors. Solve a crime in the medieval monastery by using science to understand the evidence.

CJ 450: Special Topics (3 credits):

This course focuses on the policing models implemented in different countries throughout the world. Course topics include the historical development of policing systems globally as well as existing crime and punishment models. Students will also examine and compare the different policing models in the world. Topics include analysis of the policing system of the international law enforcement organization as well as the culture of policing in France.

FERM 195: Selected Appreciation Topics in Fermentation (3 credits):

When in France and Spain, we have to explore the culture including wine and cheeses of the region. You will be asked to examine, ponder, and evaluate wines and cheeses. You will gain a greater appreciation of the many ways fermentation is used to produce foods and improve food safety in our society.

RLST 390: Early and Medieval Church History & Architecture: Focus on Pilgrimage (3 credits):

This course aims to make clearer the policies of the Roman Catholic Church across Western Europe – and especially France – during the Middle Ages. In an introductory class on prehistorical times and Antiquity, we will examine the birth of spirituality and abstract thought in mankind, and then move along to the emergence and development of Christianity during the Roman Empire.

SOC 101: General Sociology (3 credits):

This course is an introduction to the study of sociology-the scientific study of human society, cultures, languages, and societal behavior. During the semester students will review and explore several substantive areas of sociology including inequality, culture, race, family, sexuality, ethnicity, religion, deviance, social control, and change. Current events, social media, news, and daily interactions often reinforce and provide opportunities to apply course concepts to everyday life.
