

Commercial Pilot's License Professional Licensure Disclosure

What is this document?

This disclosure shares with Saint Francis University stakeholders the institution's determination concerning whether its Aviation specialization meets the educational prerequisites for licensure in each state.

What is the determination?

Saint Francis University's Aviation specialization is approved by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Because a Commercial Pilot's License is a federally established license, it has been determined that the Aviation specialization meets the educational requirements for obtaining a license in every state.

Are there any other requirements for licensure?

Yes, please note that, beyond educational requirements, there may be additional requirements for licensure. Only educational requirements are addressed in this determination. Please also note that the information below should not be construed as guaranteeing that any particular professional licensure authority will approve a student's application.

What known requirements are there?

The full eligibility requirements for a Commercial Pilot's license are located in 14 CFR 61, Subpart F. These include age requirements, English language competency requirements, aeronautical knowledge demonstration, flight proficiency demonstration, and aeronautical experience. Additionally, per 14 CFR 61.123(h): applicants for a Commercial Pilot's license must hold at least a private pilot certificate issued under this part or meet the requirements of § 61.73, which references military pilot certifications.
