"Instrument Rating" Professional Licensure Disclosure

What is this document?

This disclosure shares with Saint Francis University stakeholders the institution's determination concerning whether its Aviation specialization meets the educational prerequistes for licensure in each state.

What is the determination?

Saint Francis University's Aviation specialization is approved by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Because the "Instrument Rating" is a federally established rating, it has been determined that the Aviation specialization meets the educational requirements for obtaining an instrument rating in every state.

Are there any other requirements for licensure?

Yes, please note that, beyond educational requirements, there may be additional requirements for this rating. Only educational requirements are addressed in this determination. Please also note that the information below should not be construed as guaranteeing that any particular professional licensure authority will approve a student's application.

What known requirements are there?

The full eligibility requirements for the Instrument Rating are located in 14 CFR 61, Subpart B. These include English language competency requirements, aeronautical knowledge demonstration, flight proficiency demonstration, aeronautical experience, and the requirement that the person applying must either hold a current private pilot certificate or be concurrently applying for one.
